If you are interested in joining Chess Club it runs from 3:10-4:15 pm on Tuesdays. Every so often, pupils take part in chess competitions against other schools.


We recently played two games each against the Dragon School Chess Club who are very good. After each game, we waited for the last person to finish and then went for snacks while parents waited and chatted in another room.

Science Events

We have had a fortnight of scientific discovery for three different year groups. On Thursday 30th November, Year 6 travelled to St Edward's School for a series of Christmas science themed mini-lectures. The pupils returned to school very enthusiastic about the practical experiments which had been demonstrated, as well as the delicious refreshments and the craft kits which came from Father Christmas!

On Thursday this week, Year 3 and Year 5 took part in an outreach activity led by Charlie Rex from the University of Oxford. She is an Earth Scientist and brought in some interesting rock samples and equipment used by volcanologists. This really enriched the work our pupils have been doing about different types of rock. Not only did the children investigate the different types of rock, their properties and how they were formed, they also created their very own volcanic eruption.









Winter Mini Reading Challenge 2023

Oxfordshire Libraries announce the return of the Winter Mini Challenge!

The Reading Agency has once more teamed up with the Youth Sport Trust and public libraries, continuing with the Ready, Set, Read! theme from the Summer Reading Challenge. The Winter Mini Challenge is a free reading challenge, completely online, that tackles the holiday reading 'dip', encouraging children to keep up good habits or discover the joy of reading.

- Children will re-join the six characters from the Summer Reading Challenge, as they go on a winter walk to the library (they don't have to have done the summer challenge to join this one!)
- They will unlock virtual rewards and a special certificate by rating and reviewing books.
- A target of 3 books is recommended for children, who set their own reading Challenge. Children can read any books, including eBooks or eAudio, which can be borrowed for free from Oxfordshire Libraries.
- There will be a themed collection of eBooks to download from our Overdrive Ebook Platform
- Parents and carers can sign up their children to join the library by visiting Oxfordshire Libraries


