Dear Families,

It has been wonderful to welcome the children back to school and, after a lovely long holiday, we are all ready for learning, fun and action again!

Food is an integral part of our identity and plays a role in celebrations as well as bringing our family and communities together. As the Pope noted in his address (referenced above) sharing food is a time to be joyful, but it is important to have balance as well. Balance at a global level in food security and also in our diet and well being.

In our assemblies (and social teaching), we often talk about those who do not have enough food, and what action we can take. We had a successful collection for the Oxford Food Bank and invited the founder in to talk about the work she does. Children are encouraged to ask questions and reflect. In school, we have sensible restrictions around food and drink to support focus and learning, but also around developing a healthy and balanced diet. We sent you a letter which has been uploaded onto the website (Click here). We look forward to working with families on this important issue.

So much has already happened this term. Over these last two weeks, school volunteers have been out in force! Last Sunday, families volunteered to drive children to a chess tournament (well done our Girls A and B team for a tremendous effort). On Monday evening a PTA meeting was held with volunteers to arrange the school discos (see later in the newsletter). In addition, we have held three Governor meetings in the space of a week including our Catholic Life meeting, a Premises and Safety meeting and a Finance and Personel meeting. I want to say a huge thank you, on behalf of our community, to our PTA, our parents and Governors who volunteer their time and experience to help develop the school and offer breadth to our curriculum.


Year 3 visit from Story Teller (Story Museum)


Flyers and Information



At any given time up to 40% of adults and 50% of children (this rises to 80% with a SEND diagnosis) have difficulties with their sleep. Yet in a recent survey, almost 60% of adults felt there was a lack of support for sleep issues. Sleep problems can leave people feeling isolated and lonely.

Our free helpline is run by trained sleep advisors, many of whom are specialists in working with SEND. We can talk to young people directly, or parents (we can also talk to adults, including older people, about their sleep issues).

The helpline is open 5 times a week, Monday, Tuesday, Thursday evenings 7-9pm, and Monday, Wednesday mornings 9-11am. The number is 03303 530 541.
