

Trips and residentials are an important part of our broad and balanced curriculum. They provide pupils with opportuities to apply their learning outside of the classroom, to find out more about themselves and the world around them. We have Educational Visit Coordinators (EVC) who review the risk assessments for all trips outside of school, and also inform our insurers when trips take place outside of the core school day. Oversight by EVC colleagues means that these trips and visits take place in the safest possible way and that contingency plans are in place to help deal with anything unexpected.

We had a visitor today in Year 1 and EYFS! Frida (the 85 year old!) tortoise, came to visit thanks to Mr James. We learned all about the differences between reptiles and humans. The children were very excited feed and stroke Frida and RO did some lovely writing!



Building a Broad and Balanced Curriculum - Spring Term Review!

It is important to celebrate all that we do to extend learning and develop our broad and balanced curriculum which Catholic Education is rightly celebrated for. Here is a recap of the wonderful Spring 24 term!



Catholic Life of the School

This term our values were **compassionate & loving** and **faith-filled & hopeful.** Our social teaching focus was **family & community** and **option for the poor & vulnerable**. Our Social Justice group have been active – including collections for Sobell House and the CAFOD Big Lent Walk and family fast day.

Over this term we have celebrated St Joseph's feast day, we have held Mass in school twice to celebrate the start and end of term. We have held a reconciliation service and Fr Mervyn came in to do the Stations of the Cross with the children. We have also had CAFOD come in to talk about Catholic Social teaching (see this link for an explanation) and work with Year 3 and year 4.

Special Weeks and Focus

Over this term we have had several focused weeks and special days to reinforce aspects of our curriculum. This has included a focus on healthy eating and Science week which culminated in a open event for parents. We have also had internet safety week and celebrated reading on World Book day. International Women's day and Mother's day coincided this term as well, with a very special focus on Women.



Performance

Performance is an essential part of what we do. We are proud to provide curriculum time for public speaking and Philosophy for Children (in Year 5). This encourages pupils to have a voice and be able to both articulate their learning, but also have confidence to speak in public. This term we have had performance for both Year 4 and Year 3 as well as the iRock concert.

Trips and Visits

A range of trips for every year group this term! This takes a lot of organising and a huge thanks to the staff and office. We had Reception, Year 1 and Year 4 visit museums in Oxford City – the Natural History Museum, Science Oxford and the Ashmolean Museum respectively.



Year 3 went to Cirencester to visit the Roman museum there and Year 5 visited the Synagogue in Oxford.



And Year 6 went to the JR to the IMPs programme to learn ways to keep themselves safe.

Visitors to our school

As well as going out of schools, we invite a range of speakers into school. This term this has included Zoolab (our Mighty River sticker treat!), both hockey and football visitors as well as story tellers from the Story Museum. And just this week a young author – as spoken about earlier in the newsletter!



Curriculum Enrichment

We have specialist subjects we have chosen to do in school in different years. This includes *Philosophy for Children* (P4C) in Year 5, *touch typing* and *Chess* in Year 3& 4, *Cycling Proficiency* in Year 5. Year 3 went *swimming* this term as well. We also run *Public Speaking* sessions from Year 1 to Year 6 and are seeing a real impact of this when performing and speaking in public. Our Forest has been very flooded so nature school has been a challenge, but it is finally drying out! We are having an engineer to come and look at how we can drain it more effectively.


Competitions
